

Education in Switzerland

Switzerland has created a steady view of himself as the country's most reliable banks, the most accurate clocks, the most delicious cheeses. It is positioned as a country that has only high-quality services. The same can be said about education.

Higher education in Switzerland

Educational institutions of higher education in Switzerland are of three types: technical colleges, evening colleges and universities.

Secondary education. Formal and technical colleges train qualified specialists in various fields. The country has 120 colleges. Each has a narrow focus, the training is based on application programs for 3, 5-4 years. In evening colleges studying working people, for this reason, for foreign students they are not very suitable. Often foreign students come first in College and then in University.

Universities are almost all public (there are 12), there are also several private and two technological Institute dedicated to applied research.

There is a three-tier education system: bachelor's degree can be obtained through 3 years of training, these programmes last 1, 5-2 years. If the student wishes to obtain a PhD, then you need to study another 3 years.

Necessary documents for studying in Switzerland, it cost.

Secondary school leaving certificate with the application or the diploma of higher education.

Enrol in an educational institution. It includes the certificate that you have a Bank account. This account must be at least\$ 20,000 on accommodation and training. There is another option with a guarantee of natural or legal persons that they agree to pay the required amount.

To enter you will need a document that indicates the specific address.

Autobiography

List the subjects studied and number of hours.

If you want to study in Switzerland, no later than may all the necessary documents must be sent to the University. Tightening is not necessary, as the mail will take 2-3 months. You also need to have time in reserve in case you will be denied.

Training can be full-time, evening www.edupeet.com, remote, distance. It is also possible external training.

The students in public universities pay tuition fees of about 500 to 1,000 francs for 1 semester.

At private institutions this amount many times greater – 20000-30000 for 1 year. Elite universities, this figure reaches up to 76000 francs a year.

Scholarships are issued only to students from countries outside the EU. They are only available to foreign students in a state University who are enrolled in graduate school. Scholarship is about 1700\$.

Teaching in German, French and Italian depending on the region of the country.

Entrance exams

Twice a year for all students in early October and in late July in Fribourg pass the entrance exam. These examinations are conducted for applicants, certificates of which are recognized conventionally. To prepare for these exams you can go through the program from October to July. Training cost around 4500 CHF.

For rent 5 exams: foreign language (one that is the official language of instruction in a selected University), mathematics and world history. This is a mandatory examination, which shall be irrespective of the chosen specialty.

Further there are 2 exams to choose from: physics, geography, biology, chemistry and a second language.

The advantages of studying in Switzerland for foreigners:

The state guarantees high quality of education.

A large variety of academic programs that are closely associated with the practice.

Educational institutions for several decades are considered elite.

Can part-time from the second year of education to 15 hours a week and all day on holidays.
